

What is Campus life?

Campus Life is a day program for young autistic adults (17 to 25 year olds) transitioning to adult life. It is based at TAFE campus locations where participants can mingle with their peers in the dining hall, café and seminar rooms. It is an adult learning environment with choices and lots of fun.

The program generally involves speech therapy, an exercise class, and music therapy. Participants do a lecture quiz on current affairs and entertainment news, some further learning, and passion projects. The curriculum is accessible, visual, engaging and suitable for adults with intellectual disability. There is desensitising space and support for augmented communication.

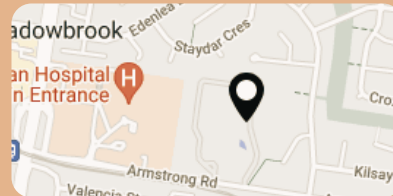


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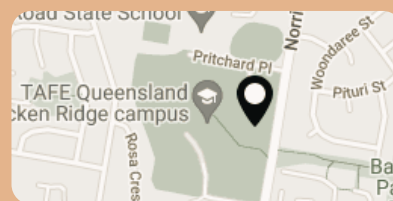

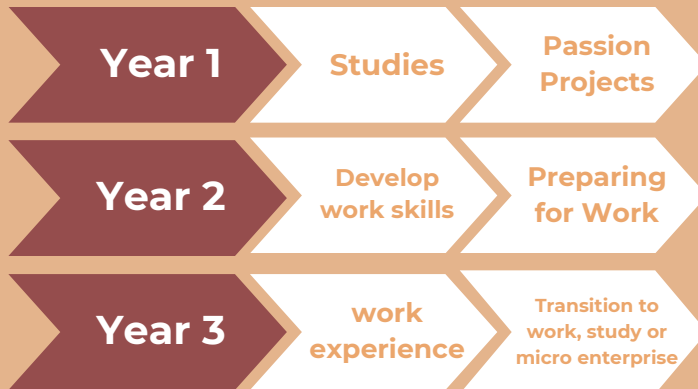
What Can Life After School Look Like?

Campus Life runs two days per week:
Monday/Tuesday
or
Thursday/Friday

The participants stay in the program for up to three years where they can learn work ready skills, extend their learning, and make friends.

Student Journey

Campus Life is a three year program. In the first year the focus is on developing social and communication skills and learning some business, health or art concepts. The second year focuses on work readiness skills and preparation for work, and then in the third year the work experience begins.



Campus Life Program

What is unique about this day program?

- It is in an inclusive environment, where you would expect to find young adults – a tertiary campus.
- It combines therapy, socialisation, and personalised learning.
- It is targeted at school leavers and young adults who are neurodivergent.
- The participants have a choice of tasks and activities.

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Costs

\$65 per hour for 1:1 support, \$32.50 per hour for 1:2 support (12 hours per week). Plus, an additional \$2.44 per hour for the centre capital costs. This is claimable from a self or plan managed NDIS fund.

Group therapy costs are at the NDIS Price Guide rate divided between the group.

Inclusive and Social

Weekly fun, interactive presentations and quizzes keep them informed of current affairs and news, and include a dance break!

Lunch can be ordered at the café, or eaten in the dining area while mingling with the students.

TAFE students are involved in supporting the Campus Life program and learning from it.



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
